The 395 Express Lanes 101



- 2 HOV lanes are becoming 3 Express Lanes
- Will work like other Express Lanes in Virginia
- New traffic pattern in the corridor
- Lanes give an option to all drivers
- Opening this fall
- \$15M in transit funding annually







How the Lanes will work



Need an E-ZPass or E-ZPass Flex

HOV-3, buses and motorcycles ride free

Cars with fewer than 3 can pay a toll

Rules apply 24/7

Dynamic tolls keep customers moving -- change based on demand as often as 10 minutes

Express Assist helps customers on the Lanes 24/7


No toll booths to keep you moving

Get ready for a better Eads Street interchange










Incentive to continue popular carpool route



How it will work

- 1. Travel north on the Lanes with sluggers & E-ZPass Flex in HOV mode
- 2. Exit at Eads Street to drop off passengers
- 3. Switch Flex to non-HOV mode
- 4. Re-enter Lanes via Eads Street ramp
- 5. Driver is not charged a toll if they re-enter during their trip










Sound wall F2 construction update & detour information









F2 construction schedule



September

Pre-work activities - clearing, silt fence, tree removal
Demo wood retaining wall
Fence removal

October and November

Post foundation drill/set Install panels

^{*} Schedule is dependent on weather and when easement is acquired









Anticipated construction impacts

Noise

The project team follows the Virginia Department of Transportation's policies to reduce the impact of construction noise on the community. Work is done overnight and all efforts will be taken to minimize noise but we do anticipate construction noise to be challenging.

Traffic Impacts

Temporary lane, ramp, and road closures will be needed to access certain sound wall sections. During any necessary ramp/road closures a detour will be provided.

Vegetation Loss

Vegetation is removed as required to build the wall. This is limited as much as possible.










Quaker Lane detour

Evergreen Trees

Arborvitae (Thuja occidentalis) 40' Ht.

Southern Magnolia (Magnolia grandiflora) 40' Ht.

Cryptomeria (*Cryptomeria japonica*) 40' Ht.

Norway Spruce (Picea abies) 60' Ht.

American Holly (*Ilex opaca*) 30' Ht.

White Pine (*Pinus strobus*) 60' Ht.

Eastern Red Cedar (*Juniperus virginiana***)** 40' Ht.





Shrubs and Flowering Deciduous

Viburnum (Viburnum rhyt.) 12' Ht.

Cherry Laurel (*Prunus lauro. 'Schipkaensis'*) 10' Ht.

Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*) Flowering – 25' Ht.

Witch Hazel (*Hamamelis virg.*) Flowering - 15' Ht.

Winterberry (*Ilex verticillata*) Winter Interest – 10' Ht.

Red-Twig Dogwood (*Cornus v.***)** Winter Interest – 8' Ht.
