Meeting Summary

Subcommittee: Erik Fessler, chair of the Bike & E-bike Subcommittee gave a brief summary of the group's first meeting on April 1. Subcommittee will be gathering information related to safe charging. Several members volunteered to contact their home owner insurance carriers to ask about e-bike coverage.

Bike Storage: Extra bike racks approved by the board have been installed. Will work to get volunteers to re-survey bike storage in laundry rooms and decommissioned laundry rooms to update assessment on bike storage needs.

Dog Washing Facility: Began general discussion on the possibility of establishing a dog washing facility in at least one decommissioned laundry rooms. Looking to results of planned Capital Improvement Resident Survey to inform interest in this type of amenity.

WaterWise Update: Efforts continue to develop water meter monitoring capability as well as improve reporting capability for overall WaterWise program. As of 3/28 there were 28 free plumbing inspections requested and 20 were completed; 28 toilet tune-ups completed; 12 old water-guzzling toilets replaced with water-efficient models; a number of leaking water faucets were either repaired or replaced. Reports from management will need more detail to get a better understanding of what has been done. Some vacant plumbing positions when program started has hampered its implementation.
