Hello, Dana.

5,000 + 8,000 RSF - Located in the Modern Austin Residences, Page's third residential tower in the Rainey Street District. Includes a 5,000 SF ground level bar/café and 9,000 SF basement level nightclub, which serve to replace the 2 bars previously on the site while maintaining Rainey Street's nightlife and rich pedestrian environment.

CMTA, currently experiencing and additionally anticipating future exponential growth in a rapidly expanding metropolitan area, required the development of facility standards for their anticipated facilities. The project work spanned a variety of standard types, from spaces to sustainability. 14,000 GSF - The renovation of this space involved multiple phases to accommodate the tenant in the existing space during construction. The conference rooms, lunchroom, and reception areas were heavily renovated, while all spaces received a minimum of a replacement of all finishes. Careful orchestration of construction paths, safe egress, and access to sufficient facilities to ensure the organization's daily schedule was not overly disrupted.

33,000 RSF - LEED ID+C Gold space on two floors of a first-generation Chinatown building. Fostering a sense of connection of staff to both the NPCA brand and the mission of the organization, and to achieve the early design directive of making an office space which would make staff and visitors feel they had "walked right into" NPCA's award-winning National Parks magazine. Materials that evoke a memory of the rich textures of the parks, as well as strong, positive environmental stories dominate throughout, all while reducing energy consumption and maintaining employee comfort.

RSF Varies - New campus locations with multiple large-scale, integrated technology classrooms, internal divisible event spaces, student amenity spaces, and faculty administration areas. Design challenges that included short onstruction schedules, reuse of existing on site materials, design to tie to existing campus, and development of school standards. Construction completed on time and ~40% under budget of comparably sized and scoped original DC campus. Renovation and re-branding of a street-level 2-story window line retail-style exposure into a space with branded elements coordinated with the Chicago TCSPP marketing department, and student amenity lounge and study capacity. Remote management and coordination of architect of record and construction team on site, as well as contributing TCSPP staff in LA and Chicago, and changing staff in the real estate and facilities departments of TCSPP.

120,000 RSF - Design-build renovation of the Frederick Douglass Memorial Hall at Howard University. Fast-paced pivot from previous Page team mid-construction amid changing budgets, supply chain issues, changing priorities and strategies. Complete redesign of lighting strategy with limited resources and restrictive budget. Proactive strategic netotiation with GC and client, as well as management of consultants and design team, to meet shifting project goals mid-pandemic.
